

From the Rectory

Dear Friends,

Earlier in the year Mary and I went to the Isles of Scilly. They lie 28 miles off the Cornish coast and comprise five inhabited islands and lots of smaller ones all owned by the Duchy of Cornwall. We stayed on Tresco which has been let to the Dorrien-Smith family for nearly 200 years.

There are three ways of getting to the Scillies: by boat on the 'Scillonian', on the Isles of Scilly Skybus service from Land's End, Exeter or Newquay airports, or by helicopter from Penzance direct to Tresco; we went out by helicopter and returned by boat on what was, thankfully, a very calm day.

I was there on a scheme arranged for clergy who can rent 'The Parsonage' halfprice in return to taking Sunday services on the neighbouring islands of Bryher and Tresco; I last did it over 25 years ago. A small boat came to collect us at 8.30am – unlike last time when it was a very low tide I didn't have to wade out to the boat; then back to Tresco for 11am – with no more duties.

Tresco is known for its glorious sandy beaches and clear blue sea; there are no cars, though there are quite a lot of mainly electric Estate vehicles. The beaches face in different directions so one can usually find one out of the wind. For those who don't want to walk, there are bicycles for hire.

Like anywhere that one returns to after a long time, things have changed on Tresco. There is now much more holiday accommodation – mainly timeshares – but the development has been concentrated around the two main centres; there are also now four good places to eat. The islands used to be known for bulb growing, but very few farmers continue that on other islands.

All in all, despite the changes Tresco largely maintains its unique, unspoilt character. There is the ongoing challenge in many areas of life, including in the church, as to whether it is possible to both hold onto the best from the past, whilst at the same introducing new things. In the Old Testament, in Isaiah 43:19 we read God's words, 'See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland', but then in the New Testament in Hebrews 13:8, we read that 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.'



Family Support Work

Dear Friends,

As the school year comes to an end we are pleased that once again the Education Department at Church House has nominated FSW as the charity to be supported at the school leaver services across the diocese, recognising our close link to many of the schools and the support that we give to the school families.

Our practitioners are gearing up for the summer activities with days out planned at, Warnham Park, Agmerhurst House, Berwick Church, and Arundel Cricket Ground as well as many local days in each area. With activities as varied as forest school, archery, swimming, crafts and teddy bear hunts, there promises to be something for everyone over the summer.

Many of our families are kinship care families – one young boy lives with grandparents, he has ADHD, and was really struggling in school and they could no longer support him, so he was excluded but there was no placement for him to go to. He was told there was no special placement, and he would have to go to the local secondary school, they did not want him. They refused to take him, but

the school was made to have him enrol whilst an alternative was sought. He got two hours at the local forest school and FSW took him out every week for nine months enabling him to grow in his confidence and his understanding of his condition. We have worked hard to get the county education department to accept the need for a special placement, and at last one has been found, starting in September. Without FSW's perseverance and



and support this young boy would probably still be waiting for a placement.



Computer Corner

Digital Security For Small Companies: Make A Plan by Roger Lyon



Security problems can start in a variety of ways. A lost laptop, a phishing email that sneaks through, or an unpatched machine can all cause trouble. Peace of mind comes from being prepared in advance so that it is just like checking the fire alarms.

Smaller companies are surprisingly attractive to opportunistic attackers. The measures that matter

most – strong passwords, multi-factor authentication, secure backups – are inexpensive, with no need for a dedicated IT department to be well defended.

Inexpensive off-the-shelf countermeasures can provide strong security. For example, £2 per month licences for *Microsoft Defender for Business* – or a similar cloud agent – can seal off an infected laptop in seconds. Similarly, changing the way that your computers find websites, using services such as *Cloudflare's* 1.1.1.2 or *Quad9*, means that many malicious links are caught before any harm occurs. Turning to cloud-based accounts such as email, most now offer multi-factor authentication using an app or text message to complement the password. Switching this security is quick and blocks the bulk of password guessing attempts. Simple steps such as these give small companies robust protection.

When looking into how to protect your company, the first step is to write down what should happen if something looks suspicious. Who picks up the phone to the IT provider? Who decides whether to take a system offline? Having a one page cheat sheet that answers those questions removes emotion from these challenging moments and keeps decisions calm and orderly. Consider having a short annual fire-drill-style walk through: the goal is familiarity, not perfection.

A key aim of the plan is to get the company trading again. A great place to start is knowing that data can be restored and where to find it. Regular, encrypted backups stored separately from day-to-day systems are like having a spare key kept with a trusted neighbour. This makes ransomware far less intimidating and can turn a potential crisis into an inconvenience. With a few further simple measures – multi-factor login prompts for staff, routine software updates, and a culture that encourages people to report odd emails without fear of blame – firms will have covered the majority of preventable mishaps.


