

From the Rectory

Dear Friends,

'And is it true? And is it true, this most tremendous tale of all, Seen in a stained-glass window's hue, a baby in an ox's stall? The maker of the stars and sea, become a child on earth for me?'

The more mature readers may know that these lines come from John Betjeman's poem 'Christmas'. The one-time Poet Laureate, knighted in 1969, campaigner and TV personality died in 1984. He grew up attending church but lost his faith at boarding school and refused to be confirmed. He came back to faith whilst at university, drawn particularly to the Anglo-Catholic High Church end of the C of E.

Betjeman once said, "The one fundamental thing is that Christ was God... Really I don't think life would be worth living if it weren't true." This emphasis on Jesus living as a man who came earth runs through all his religious poetry and appears at the climax of 'Christmas' which ends, 'That God was man in Palestine and lives today in bread and wine.'

John Betjeman believed that the presence of God could be revealed in the whole of life. He wrestled with the conflicts between his Christian beliefs and his doubts. He had a lifelong fear of death but used to sit with dying patients at St. Barts Hospital holding their hands. Those visits helped him come to terms issues in his own life and strengthened his belief that God can be experienced in the unlikeliest of places.

He once wrote to his friend, John Sparrow, "My view of the world is that man is born to fulfil the purposes of his Creator, to stand in awe of him and to dread him." He added that in this way he differed from most poets of his generation who were agnostics and had the idea that humans are either 'the centre of the Universe or a helpless bubble blown about by uncontrolled forces'.

John Betjeman constantly celebrated God's presence in the natural world, in ancient church buildings which he enjoyed visiting, and in the hearts and minds of believers and doubters everywhere. In his writing he profoundly influenced a generation in the way people looked at their surroundings, and by his sharing of his own beliefs hopes and fears, encouraging his readers to look afresh at their own attitudes and beliefs. He can still speak today to a younger generation who ask, And is it true? And is it true, this most tremendous tale of all...

Happy Christmas... when it comes.

On 2nd November an All Souls Day Service was held at Withyham. This is a service held for family and friends who have sadly lost loved ones during the year and had their funeral services in the Parish. The service is not primarily for the current year but also to remember those lost from the past, and all were welcome. A list of those we wished to remember was read out and as in previous years, this was a healing and moving service.

Remembrance Sunday happened on 9th November with another moving service at Withyham. The names of those killed in WWI and WWII were read out by our Patron. After that a short service was held at the Lych Gate at Blackham, this time with James Castle lowering the flag at the appropriate time, in the middle of the road, stopping the traffic.

The Autumn Churchyard clear up took place on Saturday 22nd November, and mainly involved leaf sweeping in some very seasonal rain! The following day, Will Hazelwood, the Bishop of Lewes, was very warmly welcomed to Withyham and conducted the Holy Communion Service.

Family Support Work November 2025 update

Dear Friends,

In November, things really began to ramp up as we prepare for Christmas in the Food Bank. The seasons shift quickly from harvest food to turkeys, gift deliveries and festive planning. Soon we will be snowed under with generous donations from our supporters. If you would like to help, please check our website or social media for the items we currently need.

We are keen to share some highlights from our work with families in October, which was an encouraging month for Family Support Work. Our main family event took place at Berwick Church during half term, and despite the rain, it was wonderfully well attended. Families enjoyed a thoughtful blend of outdoor walks and creative indoor activities, including stained-glass card making, decorated candles, Christmas crackers, clay modelling and decoupage. A warm lunch of cottage pie, and delicious cakes provided by the church made the day feel especially welcoming. Many families expressed heartfelt thanks for the event and shared how much it meant to them.

Alongside this, our practitioners continued their vital one-to-one support with families. Richard, our practitioner in Uckfield and Rotherfield, reported working with primary school children, many living with Autism, ADHD, anxiety or low self-esteem. With village schools often short on funding, FSW remains essential in bridging this gap, offering tailored emotional and practical support where statutory waiting lists are long.



October's work in numbers

- 230 visits to families
- 677 phone calls or remote support to 275 adults and 189 children
- 63 supported meetings with other agencies
- 54 group sessions held supporting 598 adults and 415 children
- 72 food deliveries made

Computer Corner

Privacy in the Age of the Pocket Computer by Roger Lyon



Our phones know a surprising amount about us – where we go, who we call, and what we browse. They are marvels of modern life, yet behind their convenience runs a quiet stream of data flowing outwards, often without our notice.

Every smartphone collects information to make things easier: location for maps, Bluetooth for earphones, Wi-Fi for quick connections, permissions so apps can use the camera or contacts. Each request feels harmless, but together they build a detailed picture of our habits. Some data helps improve services; some simply feeds advertising engines. Either way, it's easy to forget how much our pocket computers are talking behind our backs.

The good news is that protecting your privacy doesn't require technical skill – just a little attention. In your phone's *Settings* → *Privacy and Security*, review *Location Services* and decide which apps truly need them. The weather app might, the shopping app probably doesn't. Where possible, choose 'While Using the App' rather than 'Always' so tracking stops when you close it.

Next, check *Bluetooth* and *Wi-Fi* scanning. Phones can keep searching for networks even when those switches look 'off' – disable this in advanced settings. Look through *App Permissions* and remove access to the camera, microphone, or contacts for anything unnecessary. Ten quiet minutes doing this is the digital equivalent of locking the garden gate.

Modern phones also include *privacy dashboards* that show how often each app uses sensitive data. Seeing this at a glance can be enlightening – and a reminder to tidy up permissions now and then. Over the last years privacy has become less about secrecy and more about housekeeping: small, regular actions that keep our digital life in order. Your phone is more of an assistant than a mirror. It reflects your habits, but you decide what it should show.




